Opioids, which may be prescribed by doctors to treat moderate to severe pain, are now the leading killer of Americans under the age of 50. Commonly prescribed opioids include oxycodone (OxyContin), hydrocodone (Vicodin), morphine and methadone. 85% of opioid overdose is accidental and more than 6,000 children are effected each year. If you or a family member have been prescribed an opioid, Gaughn's is committed to ensuring you are aware of the risks associated with having these medications in your home, give you the information necessary to help you not only **RECOGNIZE** the signs of overdose, but be **READY** to help **RESCUE** those in need.

To fulfill this commitment, we would like to provide you with the opportunity to protect yourself along with those you love, by introducing you to our **Triple R Program**. This program consists of an emergency medication called naloxone, which is used to reverse the effects of opioids in the event of an overdose.

Our pharmacists at Gaughn's have been specifically educated on this medication, and the state of Pennsylvania has issued a standing prescription order, allowing Gaughn's Drug Store to dispense naloxone to anyone wishing to have it.
